Former GreyNet Award Recipient and Associate Professor Emeritus



Joachim Schöpfel is an Associate Professor Emeritus in Information and Communication Sciences at the University of Lille and serves as a consultant in scientific and technical information for the consulting firms Ourouk (Paris) and scidecode (Berlin). He is also a member of the GERiCO research laboratory. Schöpfel holds a PhD in psychology from the University of Hamburg and worked at the Institute of Scientific and Technical Information (CNRS) from 1991 to 2008, where he headed the library, document supply, and e-publishing, and served on the board of directors.

In 2008, he joined the University of Lille, where he led the first year of the Information-Document Master's program from 2008 to 2024, directed the department of information sciences from 2009 to 2012, and headed the Atelier National de Reproduction des Thèses (ANRT Lille) from 2012 to 2017. He has participated in several Erasmus exchanges in Slovenia and Germany and lectured in the Scientific Data Management programs at Sorbonne and Montpellier universities.

Schöpfel has been involved in the work of the French Digital Scientific Library and the Data College of the Open Science Committee. As an independent consultant, he has collaborated with Ourouk (Paris) on studies for the CNRS and the Ministry of Higher Education and Research, focusing on topics like journal platform economics, the ISTE platform, national research data repositories, and the evolution of scientific publishing. With scidecode (Berlin), he has worked on a study of persistent identifiers and is currently involved in studies on the impact of Plan S for cOAlition S and the European Science Foundation, as well as on pooling scientific information for the European CIVICA alliance.

Author of over 300 publications, Schöpfel's research centers on scientific information and communication. At Lille, he initiated several research projects in scientific and technical information (STI) and open science, including three Franco-German collaborations. He serves on the boards of euroCRIS (research information management systems), the NDLTD network (digital theses), the French Association of Information Professionals (ADBS), and the international Grey Literature Network Service (non-commercial STI). He has also worked for the AERES evaluation agency, the European Science Foundation, the Swiss National Science Foundation, and the German DFG, particularly on evaluating projects for the German national research data infrastructure (NFDI) in cultural studies. Most of his publications can be found on HAL, the national archive chosen by the French scientific and academic community for the open dissemination of its research results.

This business report is intended to provide a comprehensive, up to date overview of the work of TextRelease and its international Grey Literature Network Service. TextRelease is an independent information and publishing bureau specializing in the field of grey literature and networked information. GreyNet was founded in 1992 and re-launched in 2003 under the leadership and direction of TextRelease. Since its re-launch, it has developed into an international network capable of serving various sectors of government, academics, business and industry as well as subject based communities producing, processing, distributing, and preserving grey literature. GreyNet’s mission is dedicated to research, publication, open access, education, and public awareness of grey literature. This requires now more than ever an infrastructure commensurate to its real potential. This year’s final edition of GreyNet’s Business Report incorporates alongside Uniform Resource Locators (URLs) a number of digital persistent identifiers (PIDs), namely ORCID, ROR ID, DOI, and Crossref Funder ID. These actionable PIDs will enable the reader to easily navigate to primary sources and resources linked to a given text. National Library of Technology

National Library of Technology (hereafter referred to as "NTK") is a central professional library open to public, which offers a unique collection of 250 thousand publications freely accessible in open circulation. Its holdings form the largest collection of Czech and foreign documents from technology and applied natural sciences as well as associated social sciences. It contains a total of 1,2 Mil. volumes of books, journals and newspapers, theses, reports, standards, and trade literature in both printed and electronic forms. Besides its own collection, parts of Central Library of the CTU in Prague and Central Library of the ICT holdings are accessible in NTK.
